History of SAPHC Survive

Survive started in 2001 when a small group of SAPHC members got together for a weekend of fun on the coast at Port Aransas. "Survive" is one of Jimmy Buffett's songs with some very appropriate lyrics for this year:

"Survive, stay alive Through the thick and the thin Survive, stay alive Until it all ends

Survive, stay alive When will it all end Survive, stay alive Till I see you again"



In 2002 the club started going to South Padre Island and it became a more organized event. They stayed at the Surf Motel, played on the beach, went on a dolphin watch cruise and had music and danced at a place called Parrot Eyes. 2004 was the last year that they went to South Padre.

In 2005 the club decided to go Port Aransas where Survive has continued to be held at different locations. In 2006 they went to the Holiday Inn Sun Spree on North Padre Island. Then they tried a different type of place – the Island Retreat Condominiums for the License to Chill 2007. Then in 2008 they started going to the Mariner Inn where they were welcomed warmly.

Over the years the hotel changed ownership and management and it was renamed the Island Hotel. Survive activities have included a cookout, dolphin watch cruises, beach games, the "Blenders on the Beach" drink making contest, bonfires on the beach, music and dancing, bloody mary brunches, and a whole lot of fun.

Survive was just a party for club members and not a big charity fund raiser event in the beginning. If any money was made because registrations exceeded expenses, that money was used to pay for a band for the club Anniversary Party. When the club continued to grow and our Survive attendance maxed out the venue capacity, we took the additional funds over expenses and donated it to a charity.



History of SAPHC Survive

After Hurricane Harvey hit in 2017 we were not sure that we could go back to the island for the summer event in 2018. But the board and members decided if things were put together enough on the island to go there, we should go and help them out. We started a "Poker Run" "Pub Crawl" to get people to go spend money at some of the local businesses and charged them to play poker hands. The winners got small cash prizes and the rest of the proceeds were donated to the Amos Rehabilitation Keep (ARK), a wild life rescue organization.

In 2020 we were planning the Survive event and getting ready to start taking registration in March when the world changed with the COVID-19 virus. With the lockdown, business closures and social distancing the event was cancelled. But with things now opening up, some members are planning to go to Port A anyway - just to go have fun, be with each other, and help the local businesses out. It is not an organized club event, but will be much like the very first weekend on the beach in 2001, we just have to get "Back to the Island"!

SURVIVE is a phun/social event for our PHC members. We don't have raffles, silent auctions, booze basket, etc. as we want the attendees to relax and enjoy the Coast. It is an opportunity to get to know follow club members away from the monthly Happy Hour meetings!

One of the things we came up with to raise some money for charity a few years back is toenall painting. Our lovely ladies paint toenalls for \$10 and the proceeds go to the SAPHC Alzheimer's Walk team. It's sort of funny as a lot of the guys donate \$10 to not have their nails done! Our local Alzheimer's Association thinks it is a unique way to raise money for our walk leam!

In fact, we were lucky to be at the coast when they released seventeen sea furtles back to the wild on Saturday around Spm.

The hotel lets us set up around the pool with pop up shades and our sound system. On Friday night we had Jim Dugan, a long time Club phriend from Corpus Christi, play for us white the Club provided pizza. Saturday morning started off with the Cindy Duo, Cindy Shoffstall and Cindy Muir, playing for us white we had breakfast taces, Bloody Mary's and mimosas by the pool. Saturday afternoon was the Poker Run and Saturday night we were pleased to welcome back Jerry Diaz and Hanna's Reef for a great evening of entertainment—we think Jerry was pleased with our theme this year!


