Cash wrote the song “I Walk the Line” to ensure to Vivien that he was a faithful husband, but we all know that is not true.

Marisela's and Luis' Drink of the Month

Spicy Texas Fiesta Margarita

Servings: 1

Ingredients:

2 oz Tequila

1 oz Freshly squeezed lime juice

0.5 oz Orange liqueur

0.5 oz Agave nectar (or simple syrup)

2-4 slices Fresh jalapeño

Ice

Rim: Tajín or coarse salt + lime wedge

Garnish: Lime wheel, additional jalapeño slices



Instructions:

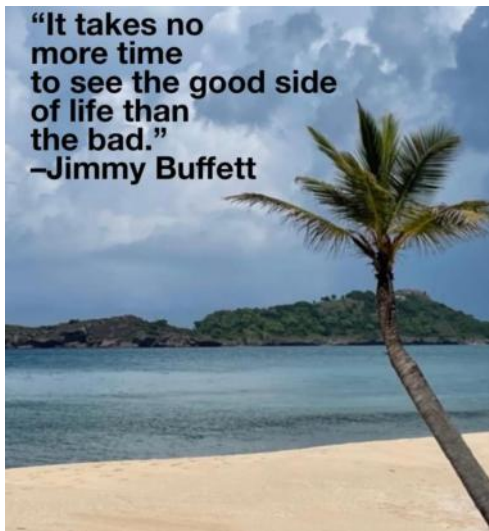
Prep the Glass: Rub a lime wedge around the rim of a rocks glass and dip it into a small plate of Tajín or salt.

Muddle: In a shaker, add the jalapeño slices and agave nectar. Muddle well to release the oils.

Shake: Add tequila, lime juice, orange liqueur, and a handful of ice to the shaker. Shake vigorously for 10–15 seconds until chilled.

Strain & Serve: Strain the cocktail into the prepared glass over fresh ice.

Garnish: Top with extra jalapeño slices and a lime wedge.
