Kathy's Recipes

VOLCANO NACHOS

Volcano Nachos are especially delicious when paired with a refreshing margarita !

- ¼ lb. ground beef
- ¼ cup Margaritaville Salsa
- ¾ cup shredded cheddar cheese
- ¾ cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
- 13 oz. bag tortilla chips
- 1 cup your favorite queso dip
- 1 medium tomato, diced
- 5-6 green onions, sliced
- ⅓ cup guacamole
- ⅓ cup sour cream
- Sliced jalapenos to taste



Preheat oven to 375°F

Cook beef in skillet over medium-high heat until browned. Add Salsa and continue cooking for 2 minutes.

In a small bowl, mix shredded cheeses together. Set aside.

Arrange a layer of tortilla chips on an oven safe plate.

Add ⅓ cup queso dip, then another layer of chips and another ⅓ cup queso,

A final layer of chips with remaining queso. Top with remaining chips.

Top with salsa-seasoned beef and remaining shredded cheese.

Place nachos in oven and bake 9-10 minutes to melt cheese.

Remove nachos from oven and add diced tomatoes and green onions.

Top with guacamole, sour cream and desired amount of jalapenos

Bay Breeze Cocktail

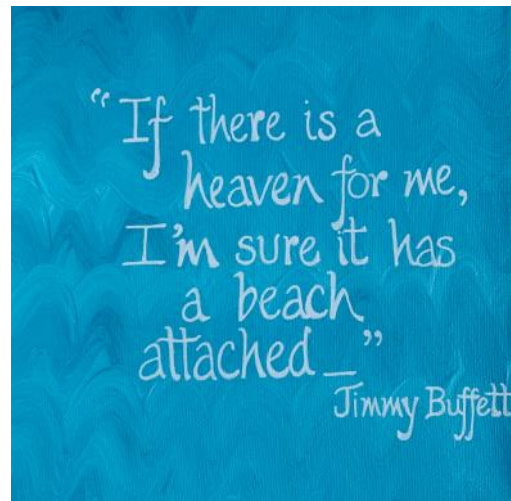
Ingredients:
