


# Notes from President Mani Andrade



# August Happy Hour





## Battered Women's Shelter

Along with the \$500.00 worth of supplies we collected \$500.00 in donated cash and the raffle to purchase additional supplies. It was my first time to visit the drop off location, quite an eye opener. The building is small but filled with a variety of donated items. At the time that I dropped off the supplies they were trying to fill back packs for 300 children that were currently in their system. I purchased the requested items on their list with the additional money and returned with more school supplies and socks and underwear. They had accepted 3 additional families the night before and were in desperate need of the clothes. Sad to see that we have such a need in this great city that we live in. The mission of the Battered Women's Shelter is to provide the tools to mend their bodies and restore their dignity, their hope, and possibilities to attain self-sufficiency without abuse. Some of our most important work has been done with children. It is with children that we have the best chance to address the generational nature of domestic violence. At the same time, we remain sharply focused in the provision of services that challenge the abusive attitudes of perpetrators, in cooperation with the justice system.

# Ronald McDonald House

## Offering strength and hope each day, everyday

On May 5, 1985, the first Ronald McDonald House opened in San Antonio and expanded to a 20 family home in 1991. On May 4, 1998, we became the sixth city in the United States to open the doors to a second 20 family home. On January 10, 2002 our third House was opened with accommodation for 10 families. This home is the first worldwide to be located within a hospital. Most recently, we have re-opened this house to a 16 bedroom home located on the 4th floor of Children’s Hospital of San Antonio due to expansion and renovation.

### Why is it needed?

Often a child with a diagnosed disease lives far from the hospital. This creates an especially stressful situation for parents, as they must cope not only with a seriously ill child, but also with the burden of being away from home for days, weeks, and sometimes months.

Before the Ronald McDonald House, the only lodging alternatives were lonely and expensive hotel rooms, or hospital cots. Finding themselves in a strange city, away from the crucial support of friends and relatives, many parents found this to be a desperately unhappy experience— at a time when their child most needed their strength, and encouragement.

The Ronald McDonald House is a home for these families. The House gives them a place where they can break away from the hospital, yet be available at a moment’s notice. Just as important, it is a place where parents can meet and talk with other families who are experiencing some of the same fears and concerns, and establish a mutual support system so critically needed at this time.

The San Antonio Food Bank provides food and grocery products to more than 500 partner agencies in 16 counties throughout Southwest Texas. In FY2015, the San Antonio Food Bank provided nearly 62 million pounds of food. So be like John Reno and play at Isla Bela's first House Concert. The mission of the SAFB is to fight hunger in Southwest Texas through food distribution, programs, education, and advocacy.

**SAPHC volunteered at the SA Foodbank on August 19th. 19 SA Parrotheads sorted 17,046 pounds of dry goods. That comes out to 897 pounds per person!!!!**


# Southern Region MOTM Shirts

Spenny or Karen Mather if you want to order a shirt.


Shirts are all prepaid/ordered. The shirts will be available to pick up at the October 17 Happy Hour. We will not have extras to sell later.

## Kathy's Recipes

### PBJ Popcorn

Here's a new adventure in sweet treats. Gourmet popcorn is elevated to a new level. Parrotheads will make this a new favorite thing!

#### Ingredients:

- 8 cups popped popcorn
- 1 cup white chocolate divided
- 1 1/2 tbsp. Welch's Natural Grape Jelly Spread
- 1 tbsp. peanut butter

#### Instructions:

1. Divide popcorn into 2 bowls.
2. Over medium low heat on the stove top, melt 1/2 cup white chocolate with 1 tbsp. peanut butter. Stir until smooth. Pour over 1 bowl of the popcorn. Use a rubber spatula to mix well and coat thoroughly. Spread on a silicon mat or parchment paper to let cool.
3. Meanwhile, melt the remaining 1/2 cup white chocolate with 1 1/2 tbsp grape jelly over medium low heat on the stovetop. Stir until smooth. Pour over the other bowl of popcorn, and stir with rubber spatula to coat well. Spread on the mat or paper to let cool.
4. Once both batches of popcorn are cooled enough that the coatings are set, mix them both together in a bowl and serve.
