

The mission of the SAFB is to fight hunger in Southwest Texas through food distribution, programs, education, and advocacy

- 36% of our clients are children, under the age of 18 years old
- 46% of households include at least one employed adult
- 67% have incomes below the federal poverty level during the previous month

It is to this end that the Elves are committed. It is to this end that the Elves welcome all citizens to participate in the Elf Louise Christmas Project.*

## Twice Baked Potato Cupcakes

As we approach the holiday season, let's be thankful and think how rich we are. Your family is priceless, your time is gold, and your health is wealth.

### Ingredients:

- 4 large russet potatoes, baked
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons heavy cream or half and half
- 1/4 cup light sour cream
- 1/4 cup cooked chopped bacon
- 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- garlic powder, salt and pepper to taste
- 2 chopped scallions



### Directions:

Scoop the insides out of the baked potatoes and place in a large mixing bowl. Mash the potatoes until smooth. Add the rest of the ingredients and mix well

Preheat oven to 400F. Place cupcake liners in a muffin pan. Spoon the mixture into the cupcake liners. Fill nearly to the top. Place in oven and bake for 20 to 25 minutes, until heated through and browned on the top.
